Course Factsheet RCVS Veterinary Nursing Level 3 Diploma (Day Release)

Venue:

Lynwood School of Veterinary Nursing, Higher Bockhampton, Dorset, DT2 8QH

About the Course:

Course Length: 21/2 years

Day release: 1 day per week over 2½ years, a minimum of 44 weeks per year.

Entry Criteria:

Five GCSEs at pass level A-C / 9-4 or equivalent Level 2 qualifications which must include English language, a science subject, and mathematics.

Please speak to a member of staff about alternative entry requirements if you do not hold a science qualification.

You must be able to provide the original qualification certificates or acquire duplicates from the examination board before admittance onto the course.

Course Fees:

Levy Funded Apprenticeships:

£6,000.00 contributions from government levy funds of which the employer must coinvest 10% over two years (£600, split into two payments of £300), plus additional tuition and external fees as below.

Non-Levy Funded Apprenticeships:

- Under 19 years on the first day of the course fully government funded (no tuition fees apply)*
- 19 years + on the first day of the course partial government funding, plus tuition and external fees as below.

*RCVS enrolment and City & Guilds registration fees still apply

£1,250+VAT per year for two years (unless student holds a degree, then full fees apply).
